Grigorios Zamparas has received critical acclaim for his versatile performing career as recitalist, orchestra soloist, and chamber musician in the United States, Greece, Bulgaria, Yugoslavia, Russia and Latin America. He is a frequent guest at numerous festivals worldwide, having performed several times at the prestigious Newport Music Festival in Rhode Island, the Mainly Mozart Festival in Miami, and the Salon of the Arts in Sofia, Bulgaria among others. He has been a featured soloist in more than twenty different piano concerti with orchestras such as the Porto Alegre Symphony in Brazil, Indiana University Symphony Orchestra, Togliati Philharmonic in Russia, the Sofia Soloists and the Sliven Philharmonic in Bulgaria. His latest commercial recording, The Youthful Beethoven with Bohuslav Martinu Philharmonic Orchestra of the Czech Republic, has been released by Centaur Records, (CRC 2725). Future engagements include a recording of Anton Rubinstein's piano concerti on the same label.

Dr. Zamparas is Assistant Professor of Music at the University of Tampa, where he oversees the piano program. He received his first piano degree in 1995, studying with the Greek pedagogue, Yorgos Manessis. He holds a DMA degree from the University of Miami, where he studied with pianist Ivan Davis. Zamparas also holds MM degrees from Indiana University, and the Aristotle University of Thessalonica, Greece.

Katerina Albanis, a native Miamian, received a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from Barry University, and a Masters degree in Business Administration from Florida International University. She is a Health Care Representative for Pfizer Pharmaceuticals.
